



## Daffodils

You will need:

- Daffodil petal sheet (2 petals per child)
- Green straws
- Yellow, orange crepe paper (approx. 6 x 10 cm)
- Split pins
- Glue or tape
- Several empty cotton reels
- Scissors
- Stiletto or large needle
- Dyed newspaper (green)

1. Cut out daffodil petals - colour if desired.
2. Wrap strip of crepe paper around the cotton reel and secure with glue or tape.
3. Fold the end of the crepe paper in to create a cup shape and glue in place.
4. Use fingers to gently pull the crepe paper into a trumpet shape stretching the open end to flute it.
5. Remove the cotton reel.
6. Take a straw, two of the petals and the paper trumpet – push the split pin through the trumpet, both petals and the straw to assemble the daffodil. Open the pin out to secure.
7. Wrap a strip of dyed newspaper around stem for leaves and tape in place.

To make it easier for younger students I have provided the petals all in one piece – you could use small patty pans for the trumpet of the flower as well.
