



## Tunnel Book (Folded Version)

### The Treasure Box

By Margaret Wild and Freya Blackwood.

Freya Blackwood has used various paper techniques to illustrate this book. Look carefully at the illustrations to see how she has achieved this three-dimensional technique.

You will need:

- A4 cover paper for book cover
  - Additional cartridge or cover paper or light card for the pages
  - Pencil
  - Fine black permanent marker
  - Eraser
  - Colour pencils or watercolour pencils (Optional)
  - Scissors (preferably sharp pointed)
  - Exacto knife (or similar – optional)
  - Cutting mat (optional)
  - PVA glue
1. Fold the A4 sheet in half lengthways cut carefully along the fold
  2. Leaving approximately 10 cm at the end , fold each piece in a concertina fold, keeping the folds about 2 cm wide.
  3. Cut the remaining light card into 10.5cm square pieces (these will be the back of the book and the pages)
  4. Glue the back onto the end of the concertina folds, forming the sides. This will also help the book to stand up as you work.
  5. Decide the design of the pages of your book, you will need at least 3 pages: foreground, middleground and background. (The more pages you add the more depth your tunnel will have.
  6. Draw a frame around the edge of each page, at least on both sides and the bottom.
  7. Sketch each page design onto a separate piece of paper. Ensure that some of the elements overlap to give depth.
  8. Working on one page at a time, carefully draw your illustration within the frame. Outline your drawing with a fine black pen, using small dots to add shade. Add any text you want to the pages.
  9. Colour any elements that you want to have coloured. Then cut out all excess background. Follow the same procedure for the other pages.

10. Slide your completed pages into the folded sides, keeping them in the correct order. Arrange to form a pleasing picture and glue frames into the folded sides.
11. Decorate the front cover.
